Services

The IP attachés advocate to improve IP policies, laws, and regulations abroad for the benefit of U.S. stakeholders, including:

- Raising issues with foreign government officials
- Providing training on IP law, enforcement, and administration
- Conducting public awareness programs
- Presenting and explaining U.S. government positions

The IP attachés provide information to help U.S. stakeholders entering foreign markets or conducting business abroad, including:

- How to navigate foreign laws and regulations
- How foreign courts and governments work
- How to protect and enforce IP abroad
